- Offering a series of online classes on literature searching, referencing and Zotero. <u>The calendar</u> <u>of classes is on the library's website.</u>






NEW ONLINE RESOURCES TO EXPLORE

The University Library <u>recently announced on its</u> <u>blog</u> the acquisition of several imporant online resources for students and researchers. Two new databases of particular interest to anthropology and archaeology include:

- Anthropology Resource Library, an extensive collection of ethnographic videos, music recordings, field notes and other primary documents.
- World Heritage Sites, Africa, a versatile collection of more than 86,000 objects of visual, contextual, and spatial documentation of African heritage and rock art sites.

All 900+ databases that the university subscribes to are available from the **<u>Databases A-Z page</u>**, and are searchable by name, subject and type.



CLASSES AND WRITING SESSIONS FOR LENT TERM

Another great tool is **BrowZine**, which gives you full-text access to thousands of academic journals, sorted by title and subject (be sure to install the Cambridge version of BrowZine).
